

Vespers on Great and Holy Monday (with Pre-sanctified Liturgy)

On "Lord I have cried" (beginning in Tone 1) - ten stichera are sung:

(10) Reader: Bring my soul out of prison:

descant
chant
melody

That I may confess Thy name.

Vespers on Holy Monday

(9) *Reader:* The righteous shall wait patiently for me
